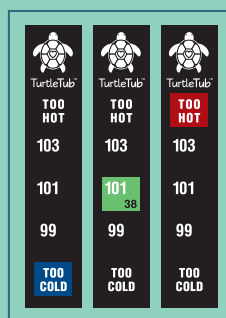

### Notes:

- (1) Items TT1100 & TT1101 comprise a single-patient use system that enable the hospital to perform multiple baths on the same patient. With this system the TurtleTub becomes the patient's bathtub and it can be gifted to the family at discharge. This is the most baby friendly and the most family-centered care system. Patient satisfaction scores are likely to benefit from using this system. Items TT1103 & TT1108 complement this system.
- (2) Items TT1106 and TT1107 comprise an alternative system that enable the TurtleTub to be reused on multiple patients, using a disposable liner.
